Disclosure of a speaker's identity is purely voluntary during the public comment period.

Safe Drug Disposal Presentation

Requested Action:

Financial Impact:

Background Information:

Safe disposal of unwanted medications is necessary to prevent them from being stockpiled in homes, where they can be abused, or improperly discarded in toilets or the trash and, as a result, can contaminate the environment. Currently, Tehama County operates a safe disposal program and “drug take-back” events. Two permanent safe drug disposal kiosks are sited at the Tehama County Sheriff’s Department in Red Bluff and the Corning Police Department in Corning. Two DEA-funded one-day collection events are typically held each year, as well. Unfortunately, the funding for both of these programs relies on the continued sponsorship of the DEA, without which Tehama County residents will be left without a safe and reliable disposal option. An informational presentation will be given jointly by the Tehama County Health Services Agency Drug and Alcohol Division and the Tehama County Department of Education regarding current drug disposal programs and other options that may be available for residents. Other stakeholders include the Tehama County Sheriff’s Department, Tehama County Drug and Alcohol Advisory Board, the Tehama County Department of Environmental Health, the Tehama County Strategic Prevention Framework Steering Committee, and the Agency.

The Agency invites Board members and the public to attend this informational presentation. Attendance is not necessary, but welcome. The presentation is being agendized as a Brown Act meeting in the event there is a quorum present. No decisions will be made during the presentation.
