

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

TUESDAY, JANUARY 5, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Dale Pickell, Raymond Snelson, Rudolph Brodnansky, Earl Davies and George A. Hoag. Also present was District Attorney Robert W. Trimble. Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

At this time the Clerk called the meeting to order and asked for nominations for the position of Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the year 1965. Supervisor Snelson nominated Earl Davies for the office of Chairman, which was seconded by Supervisor Hoag. No further nominations being received, the Clerk declared nominations closed and by the unanimous vote of the Board of Supervisors stated that Supervisor Earl Davies effected Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the 1965 year.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Rudolph Brodnansky be appointed Vice-Chairman of the Board of Supervisors for the year 1965.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that all County officials be authorized to leave the State of California whenever necessary on either official or private business during the year 1965.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Fickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that members of the Tehama County Board of Supervisors be authorized to attend any meetings during the year 1965 considered to be of benefit to the County of Tehama.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that minutes of the Board of Supervisors be published in the Corning Daily Observer for the year 1965.

BIDS-Bulk Gas and Oil-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that bids for bulk oil and gasoline for a period of one year, effective February 1, 1965, be opened on Friday, January 22, 1965 at 10:00 a.m. and considered for award by the Board on Tuesday, January 26, 1965 at 10:30 a.m.

At this time Hospital Administrator Louis F. Nedopad appeared before the Board to present an oral report on activities at the Tehama County Hospital.

**TRANSFER OF FUNDS-SHERIFF-**

Pursuant to the request of the Sheriff, and with the approval of the Auditor, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to transfer \$2,286.88 from Contingency Fund to Fixed Assets of Sheriff's budget, one black four-door sedan patrol car; and \$675.00 from Contingency Fund to Fixed Assets of the Sheriff's budget, car radio.

**TRANSFER OF FUNDS-**

Pursuant to the request of the department heads, and with the approval of the Auditor, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make the following transfer of funds:

\$200.00 from office supplies, Budget Item No. 17, to Professional Services, Budget Item No. 18.

Agricultural Commissioner-2061  
\$200.00 from Agriculture, Code 4, to Equip. Maintenance, Code 12.

**ASSESSMENTS & TAXES-**

Pursuant to the request of the United States Department of the Interior, and with the consent of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make a cancellation on the current fiscal year Assessment Rolls, under the provisions of Section 4986 of the Revenue and Taxation Code on property conveyed to the United States of America by R. Kenneth Sims and Theresa Sims, recorded in Volume 460, page 308 of Tehama County Official Records.

**DISTRICT ATTORNEY-**

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a Summons received in Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 12811, Robert L. Underwood vs. County of Tehama, et al, be denied and referred to the District Attorney.

**DISTRICT ATTORNEY-**

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a Summons received in Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 12819, Clifford F. O'Connor, et al, vs. County of Tehama and City of Red Bluff, be denied and referred to the District Attorney.

At this time discussion was held on a proposed ordinance to adopt zoning for the rural area surrounding the City of Corning, north section flood plain zoning along the Sacramento River, Black Butte Reservoir area and rezoning of Robert Bradley property.

**ORDINANCES-SUPERVISORS ORDERS-**

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that adoption of an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 213, being the Tehama County Zoning Enabling Ordinance, be postponed one week to allow additional study on the matter.

WATER DISTRICTS-Proberta-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Board of Supervisors sit as a Board of Equalization to hear any objections to the assessments of the Proberta Water District on January 26, 1965 at 10:00 a.m.

A letter was read from the Tehama County Planning Commission requesting that a member of the Board of Supervisors meet with the Planning Commission on January 21, 1965 at 10:00 a.m. to discuss a uniform policy on percolation tests on subdivision sites. Chairman Davies instructed the Clerk to notify the Commission that as many Board members as possible will attend said meeting.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Supervisor Rudolph Brodnansky be appointed to serve as a Director to represent the County of Tehama in the Northern California County Supervisors Association for the year 1965.

DISTRICT ATTORNEY-PERSONNEL-

Pursuant to the request of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the employment of Elmer R. Jennings as part time Deputy District Attorney be approved, effective January 25, 1965, at \$600.00 per month; and that the District Attorney be requested to prepare a contract concerning said employment for the Board's consideration.

ROAD DEPARTMENT-PERSONNEL-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that all employees of the Tehama County Road Department be paid overtime at their existing wage scale during the emergency of 1964-1965, due to storms.

ROAD DEPARTMENT-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Road Commissioner be authorized to take necessary steps to obtain inmates from Plum Creek Honor Camp and other honor institutions for labor in connection with flood control and flood damage.

A telegram was read from Governor Edmund G. Brown informing the Board that meetings will be held as soon as possible to determine the most effective methods of recovery in flood ravaged counties.

MINUTES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Minutes of the previous meeting be approved as mailed.

WARRANTS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the General Warrant Register, 1964-65, pages 238 to 244, inclusive, as presented by the Auditor, be approved and filed.

AUDITOR-SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign approval on a claim submitted by the State Compensation Insurance Fund in the amount of \$5,500.00 for the period covering September 20, 1964 to December 30, 1964.

JURIES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following action be placed on record:

Pursuant to an order made by the honorable Curtiss E. Wetter, Judge of the Superior Court of the State of California, in and for the County of Tehama, and filed January 4, 1965, designating the number of trial jurors as 350 that will be required for the business of the Superior Court during the year 1965, and in compliance with said order, the Board proceeded to draw 350 names. In computing the number to be used as to population in each of the Supervisorial Districts, jurors were drawn as follows: (See Supervisors Minute Book 3)

Letters were received from the Agricultural Commissioner and District Attorney's office requesting reclassification and raise in salary for certain employees. The matter was discussed and postponed until next Board meeting for further study.

SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICTS--Corning-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Thomas J. Chedester be appointed as a member of the Board of Directors of the Corning Soil Conservation District, effective January 5, 1965, to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of George A. Hoag.

At this time Supervisor Snelson discussed the matter of residents in the Vina area wishing a fire truck for their protection during the winter months. The Board decided to invite William Siler of the State Division of Forestry to the Board's next meeting to discuss the matter.

Clayton Hill appeared before the Board to state that his term has expired as a member of the Board of Appeals in connection with building inspection within the County and that he does not wish to serve on said committee in the future.

Supervisor Hoag requested that the District Attorney investigate the matter of returning money and paying attorney's fees to E. C. Pryor in connection with Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 10611, County of Tehama, et al, vs. E. C. Pryor, et al.

Charles Rains of Griffenhagen-Kroeger, Inc., appeared before the Board to request permission to review questionnaire forms completed by County employees at the time his firm last made a salary survey for the County. The Board members suggested that Raymond Anchordoguy, former Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, be contacted on the matter.

There being no further business appearing the meeting adjourned at 11:46 a.m., subject to call.
