

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Rudolph Brodnansky, Earl Davies, George A. Hoag, Dale Pickell and Raymond Snelson.

Chairman Earl Davies presided; Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

At this time the Hospital Administrator appeared before the Board to discuss activities of the Tehama County Hospital. The Board was informed that a quarterly medical staff meeting was held on February 15, 1965, and problems which have arisen were discussed.

Mr. Nedopad informed the Board that old unusable drugs have been returned to the firms from which they had been purchased and refunds have been granted to the hospital.

Mr. Nedopad stated that various organizations have granted monetary gifts to the Hospital for its use and asked if such funds, which have been placed in a Hospital Estates Trust Fund, could be used for purchasing furniture and equipment for the Hospital in the near future.

TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Tehama County Hospital be authorized to use the Hospital Estates Trust Fund for hospital equipment needs, subject to approval of the District Attorney.

The Hospital Administrator distributed copies of old accounts receivable for the Tehama County Hospital, comprised of welfare recipients, which have been uncollectable. The Board recommended that the Hospital Administrator discuss the matter of attempting to collect these old accounts receivable with local collection agencies, with the fee paid to be a percentage of the total amount collected.

The Hospital Administrator distributed newly prepared Admission and Discharge Record forms which are now being used by the Tehama County Hospital, for the Board's information.

Pursuant to the recommendation of the District Board of Directors, a motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Ralph V. Murchisen and Harry A. Baker be reappointed as members of the Board of Directors of the Cottonwood Soil Conservation District for additional four year terms, commencing March 2, 1965.

#### DISTRICT ATTORNEY-COUNTY PROPERTY-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a letter received from Mr. Fred A. Brockman inquiring about the Anne Hill property located in Antelope Valley on Paynes Creek Road be referred to the District Attorney.

#### PERSONNEL-TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL-

Pursuant to the request of the Hospital Administrator, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following reclassification be approved: Zena York from Kitchen Helper, Range 10, Step E, \$296.00 per month, to Cook, Range 14, Step C, \$325.00 per month, effective February 16, 1965.

#### DISTRICT ATTORNEY-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a Notice of Application for Withdrawal of Deposit concerning Parcels 9A, 9B and 9C in Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 12419, People of the State of California vs. Francisca J. Anderson, et al, be referred to the District Attorney.

A letter was read from Latane Sale, temporary chairman, and Sydney Lindacher, temporary secretary, informing the Board of a group in the process of being formed to be known as "Friends of the Library".

AUDITOR-WELFARE DEPARTMENT -

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the claim of The Regents of the University of California in the amount of \$560.00 for tuition for 12 Social Workers and 2 Social Work Supervisors for attendant of an extension course, be approved.

ASSESSMENTS & TAXES-

Pursuant to the request of the Division of Highways, and with the consent of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make the following cancellations on the current fiscal year Assessment Rolls, under the provisions of Section 4986 of the Revenue and Taxation Code on property conveyed to the State of California by:

(a) Condemnation Judgment in Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 12300, People vs. Ima Stoll, et al, Parcel 5: Edward W. and Jewel Quisenberry, Assessment #16316: 1964-65 City<sup>th</sup> and County taxes to be cancelled under Bill #16316. 1963-64 City and County taxes to be cancelled under Bill #13700-1. Taxes prorated to date by Order of Possession.

(b) Condemnation Judgment in Tehama County Superior Court Civil Case No. 12279, People vs. Gabriel Perez, et al, Parcel 5: Vernon J. Benjamin, Assessment #16317-A: 1964-65 County and City taxes to be cancelled under Bill #16317-A. 1964-65 Sewer Dist. #4 Bond taxes were paid 2/15/65. 1963-64 taxes delinquent - to be pro-rated as of November 12, 1963, and cancelled. 1963-64 Sewer District #4 bond taxes, plus penalty, to be paid.

At this time a letter was read from the Tehama County Flood Control and Water Conservation District which transmitted copies of District resolutions officially requesting a loan in the amount of \$50,000.00 and creating a District Flood Relief Revolving Fund. Board members stated that the loan had been granted by the Board on January 26, 1965.

ROADS & BRIDGES-Kimball Road #92-

Resolution No. 8-1965, a resolution allowing the City of Red Bluff to designate Kimball Road adjacent to the City as a City Select System Street, was offered by Supervisor Snelson and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 65)

The Road Commissioner distributed copies of a Building Inspector's activity report for the month of January, 1965, which was reviewed by the Board.

ROADS & BRIDGES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Road Department be authorized to negotiate with the El Camino Irrigation District for the relocation of District facilities for the approximate amount of \$5,443.50 in connection with FAS Project 1079 (4), Gyle Road.

ROADS & BRIDGES-Hoag Road and Solano Street-

Resolution No. 9-1965, a resolution relinquishing portions of Hoag Road and Solano Street from the county highway system, was offered by Supervisor Hoag and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 67)

AGREEMENTS--ROADS & BRIDGES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign a Free Use Application and Permit directed to the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, requesting the grant of 12,000 tons of pit run rock to be used for repairing and resurfacing of county roads damaged by December 1964 floods.

AGREEMENTS--ROADS & BRIDGES-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign agreements with Hilda Gupton Setzer, granting to the County the right to take gravel from the Setzer property on and near Stoney Creek; with Grover C. and Eda J. Davis, granting to the County the right to take gravel from Thomes Creek; and with Earl and Marie Foor, granting to the County the right to take gravel from Singer Creek.

At this time a letter received by the Board from Forward Bros. Properties concerning a road problem in the Mantón area was discussed with the Road Commissioner. The Board requested the Road Commissioner to discuss the matter with representatives of the Diamond National Corporation and Forward Bros. Properties to determine whether or not a solution can be reached.

Discussion was held as to whether or not a regular Road Department employee could be granted a leave of absence and be hired for flood repair work and still qualify for reimbursement under P. L. 984 and 875. Chairman Davies telephoned Mr. Ralph Hilton of the California Disaster Office in Sacramento and was informed that he would return his call later in the day to let the County know if such a situation discussed could qualify for reimbursement.

Supervisor Brodnansky informed the Road Commissioner that complaints have been given concerning Plymire Road being littered with trash. The Sheriff and Road Commissioner were requested to prepare a schedule for jail trustees to pick up trash along Plymire Road.

Mr. Robert McClure, Chief, Bureau of Exhibits of the California State Fair and Exposition, appeared before the Board to pay his respects and discuss results of the County's exhibit displayed at the last State Fair in Sacramento.

Dr. A. M. Fratis, County Health Officer, appeared before the Board to distribute copies of nursing activities report of the County Health Department for the period commencing January, 1964 through December, 1964.

Chairman Davies stated that Mr. Hilton of the California Disaster Office has informed him that funds could be reimbursed under P.L. 984 but not under P. L. 875 for regular county employees who would request a leave of absence and be rehired to do flood damage repair work for the County.

At this time Attorney Rawlins Coffman and Mr. Joseph Arbini appeared before the Board to discuss the financial condition of the Red Bluff Garbage Service, in connection with a garbage collection franchise granted by the County to Mr. J. C. Cook.
