

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR OCTOBER 13, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors George Hoag, Rudolph Brodnansky Raymond Snelson, Earl Davies and Dale Pickell.

Chairman Earl Davies presided; Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

At this time the Assessor and Tax Collector appeared before the Board to submit an explanation in connection with 39 requests for adjustments of the 1965-66 Assessment Rolls. Discussion was held by the Board.

At this time Briant Woolley, representative of Hydrotex Industries, appeared before the Board to distribute literature concerning lubricant products sold by his firm.

At this time the Hospital Administrator appeared before the Board and reported that the re-roofing of the Tehama County Hospital is now in process. An intercom system is also being installed at the present time. An oral report concerning the revenue and census of the hospital for the months of July, August and September, 1965, was given.

#### PERSONNEL--TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL--

Pursuant to the request of the employee, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Irene Heinle, Nursing Attendant at the Tehama County Hospital be granted a two month leave of absence due to illness, effective October 8, 1965.

At this time Rawlins Coffman, Secretary of the Red Bluff Lake Commission, appeared before the Board to report on a meeting held with various interested agencies in connection with the proposed Red Bluff Lake and its facilities. Earl S. Lindauer and Carl Grondona, members of the Lake Commission and Harlan Warwick, City of Red Bluff representative, were also present for the discussion.

#### SUPERVISORS ORDERS--AGREEMENTS--

Resolution No. 79-1965; a resolution authorizing the Chairman to sign a State<sup>ment</sup> of Intent, which indicates the County's support for a recreation project managed by the Division of Beaches and Parks at the proposed Red Bluff Lake site; was offered by Supervisor Pickell and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. The District Attorney informed the Board that the Tehama County Farm Bureau opposes an application submitted by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company to the Public Utilities Commission, which requests permission to raise rural rates and decrease city rates. The matter was referred to Supervisor Hoag by the Chairman.

At 11:15 a.m. the District Attorney was excused.

The Road Commissioner appeared before the Board, distributed copies of an activists report concerning the Building Inspector for the month of September, 1965, and reviewed its contents.

#### ROAD DEPARTMENT--

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Road Commissioner be authorized to arrange for the return of a stolen county pick-up, which is now being held at Reno, Nevada.

#### AGREEMENTS--ROAD DEPARTMENT--

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign a Materials Agreement with C. S. Church, which grants to the County the right to take gravel from Brannon Creek on the Church property east of the intersection of Highway 99W and Woodland Avenue.

An agreement between the County of Tehama and P. E. Neves and Beverly A. Neves was read by the Clerk. Action was postponed on the matter to allow Board members to view the site involved in connection with construction of FAS Project 1079(4).

At this time Mrs. Pritchard and Mrs. Baker appeared before the Board to oppose the construction of a temporary bridge on Bowman Road. The Road Commissioner explained that the replacement of the damaged bridge is a major project and there is insufficient time and employees to begin at this late date. A complaint was also given of the condition of Bowman and Evergreen Roads.

MINUTES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Minutes of September 28 and October 5, 1965, be approved as mailed.

WARRANTS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the General Warrant Register, 1965-66, pages 101 to 107, inclusive, as presented by the Auditor, be approved and filed.

PERSONNEL-ROAD DEPARTMENT-

Pursuant to the request of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the appointment of Sam Carl Echols as extra help Construction Maintenance Worker I, Range 19, Step A, \$376.00 per month, effective October 4, 1965, be approved for the Road Department.

PERSONNEL-TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL-

Pursuant to the request of the Hospital Administrator, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the appointment of Irvin Eugene Lilly as extra help Nursing Attendant, Range 14, Step A, \$1.70 per hour, effective October 8, 1965 at the Tehama County Hospital be approved.

ASSESSMENTS & TAXES-

Pursuant to the request of the United States Department of the Interior, and with the approval of the Assessor and Tax Collector and consent of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make a cancellation on the 1965-66 Assessment Rolls, under the provisions of Section 4986 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, on property conveyed to the United States of America by Ray Elder, et al, recorded in Volume 474, page 139 of Tehama County Official Records.

DISTRICT ATTORNEY-

Resolution No. 80-1965; a resolution authorizing the District Attorney to execute a Disclaimer in that certain proceeding entitled "United States of America vs. 106.06 acres of land in the County of Tehama, Floyd F. Beauchamp, et al", Civil No. 9368 now pending in the United States District Court in and for the Northern District of California; was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. A letter was read from the Tehama County Veterans' Service Officer which requested the Board to set a bond for the Tehama County Public Guardian. The matter was referred to the District Attorney for a recommendation as to the amount of bond sufficient for this county.

BIDS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that October 25, 1965 at 10:00 a.m. be set for opening bids for two automobiles for the Welfare Department, one pick-up for the Animal Control Department and three automobiles for the Sheriff's office, with said bids to be considered for award by the Board on October 26, 1965 at 10:30 a.m.

A letter was read from the Tehama County Planning Commission which requests members of the Board to attend their meeting of October 21, 1965 to discuss Unit No. 3 of the Ponderosa Sky Ranch Subdivision. The Clerk was requested to inform the Commission that those members who do not attend a Supervisors' Association meeting scheduled for that date will attempt to be present for the Commission's meeting.

AUDITOR-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the claim of State Compensation Insurance Fund in the amount of \$5,500.00 be approved as a premium payment on Policy No. 45507-65.

Supervisor Brodnansky reported to the Board that on October 5, 1965, be accompanied Division of Forestry personnel to view available fire trucks and placed a bid for a used truck to be assigned to the Lassen View Volunteer Fire Department.

There being no further business appearing the meeting adjourned at 12:12 pm.
