

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 19, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Rudolph Brodnansky, Raymond Snelson, Earl Davies and Dale Pickell. District Attorney Robert W. Trimble was also present. Absent: Supervisor George Hoag.

Chairman Earl Davies presided; Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

At this time the Hospital Administrator appeared before the Board to report on activities of the Tehama County Hospital.

PERSONNEL-ROAD DEPARTMENT-

Pursuant to the request of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that the following appointments for the Road Department be approved:

1. George Chapman, extra help Construction Maintenance Worker I, Range 19, Step A, \$376.00 per month, effective October 8, 1965.
2. Gerald Atkins Babb, extra help Construction Maintenance Worker I, Range 19, Step A, \$376.00 per month, effective October 6, 1965.

TRANSFER OF FUNDS-TEHAMA COUNTY PARKS-

Pursuant to the request of the Camp Committee, and with the approval of the Auditor, a motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that the Auditor be authorized to transfer \$917.19 from Contingencies to Camp Tehama Budget, Fixed Assets, Swimming Pool.

A refund in the amount of \$76.72 was received from the Tehama-Colusa Canal Ground Breaking Committee in connection with Tehama County's donation towards the canal ground breaking ceremonies and was ordered to be deposited.

AUDITOR-DISTRICT ATTORNEY-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the District Attorney, Resolution No. 81-1965, a resolution appointing the Auditor as the County's agent for the purpose of filing any application on behalf of the County with the State for reimbursement of funds expended for a public defender, was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board members present. PROBATION OFFICER-WELFARE DEPARTMENT-

Pursuant to the request of the Probation Officer and Welfare Director, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that a maximum of \$95.00 per month, per child, be allowed for placement of foster children, when said children are deemed as special cases.

The Welfare Director discussed burial fees of indigents who own lots in the Los Molinos Cemetery. The District Attorney was requested to investigate the matter.

At 10:25 a.m. Supervisor George Hoag appeared to sit with the Board.

Discussion was held concerning the preparation of legal documents and the handling of legal matters in connection with the Public Guardian. The District Attorney stated that we would be willing to act as legal counsel for the present time.

WELFARE REPORT-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the recommendations of the Welfare Director regarding state and county aid to indigents be accepted; for a record of these actions reference is made to Orders for Welfare Department, Book 17.

Fred Brown and the Road Commissioner appeared before the Board. Mr. Brown informed the Board that the middle span of the Pine Creek Bridge on Meridian Road has been filled with rock and is diverting the flow to either side. The Road Commissioner was requested to investigate the matter and arrange for necessary work if the bridge is in danger.

AGREEMENTS-ROADS & BRIDGES-FAS 1079(4)-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to execute an agreement with P. E. Neves and Beverly A. Neves, which provides for the Neves to convey property to the County for use on the construction of FAS Project 1079(4).

ROADS & BRIDGES-

Resolution No. 82-1965, a resolution accepting a Grant Deed from P. E. Neves and Beverly A. Neves, was offered by Supervisor Hoag and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 169)

ROADS & BRIDGES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Road Commissioner be authorized to proceed with oiling Del Norte Drive within the Westwood Subdivision, Unit No. 2, with residents of the area to provide cost of materials involved.

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-TEHAMA COUNTY PARKS-

Resolution No. 83-1965, a resolution approving a project entitled Mill Creek Recreational Area for \$75,000.00 within the County of Tehama and requesting the State to process said application at the earliest possible date, was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 170)

SUPERVISORS ORDERS-TEHAMA COUNTY PARKS-

Resolution No. 84-1965, a resolution authorizing the Road Commissioner to execute on behalf of the County an Application for State Grant Program for a Mill Creek Recreational Area project, was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 172)

Proposed plans, as prepared by Clair A. Hill and Associates, for necessary repairs to make a building located at 624 Washington Street earthquake-resistant were submitted by the Road Commissioner. A letter received from Lloyd G. Sinclair of Affiliated Brokers, representing owner Jim Manter, was read by the Clerk which sets forth terms for sale of said building. The Road Commissioner was requested to prepare financial information and present same to the Board.

At this time a public hearing was called to order for the purpose of considering proposed rezoning of property along U. S. Highway 99-W, south of Corning. There being no objections presented, the hearing was closed.

ZONING-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the proposed rezoning of property along U. S. Highway 99-W, south of Corning, on the general vicinity of the highway's intersection with Woodland Avenue, northerly, past its intersection with Viola Avenue, be approved and the proper ordinance adopting said C-2-S zoning be prepared for Board consideration.

Lisa Ferguson, member of the Tehama County Planning Commission, appeared before the Board to present an oral summary of a Planning Commission meeting recently attend at Yosemite.

A letter was read from Mrs. Susan Allwardt requesting information concerning the subject of the county executive, from his necessity through his dismissal. The Board informed the Clerk that Mrs. Allwardt should be furnished the names and addresses of Walter W. Dale and Albert Hornbeck.

AUDITOR-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following claims be approved:

1. Judson Steel Corporation in the amount of \$7,492.58 for Road Department steel.
2. Minch's Wholesale Meats in the amount of \$1,341.02 for Tehama County Hospital meat products for August and September, 1965.
3. Foremost Dairies in the amount of \$670.30 for Tehama County Hospital dairy products.

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved as mailed.

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the General Warrant Register, 1965-66, pages 108 to 114, inclusive, as presented by the Auditor, be approved and filed.

Resolution No. 86-1965, a resolution requesting that legislation or policy be established to eliminate the necessity for completing OCD Form 376 to justify certain unlisted items, was offered by Supervisor Snelson and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.
