

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MINUTES

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Dale Pickell, George Hoag, Rudolph Brodnansky, Earl Davies and Raymond Snelson. District Attorney Robert W. Trimble was also present.

Chairman Earl Davies presided; Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

AGREEMENTS-DUMPS-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the agreement with Ted Bennett providing for his services as caretaker of the Tehama Dump be terminated, effective December 2, 1965.

BIDS-ROAD DEPARTMENT-

Pursuant to the request of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that November 19, 1965 at 10:00 a.m. be set for opening bids for furnishing the Road Department with fencing material, one dump truck and steel materials, with said bids to be considered for award by the Board on November 23, 1965, at 10:30 a.m.

The Road Commissioner explained a construction problem at the intersection of Blackburn and Barham Avenues. He was requested to further discuss the matter with the Division of Highways and, if possible, request a representative of the Division of Highways present for the Board's next meeting.

AGREEMENTS-ROAD DEPARTMENT-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign an agreement with Carl Spanfeiner and Doris L. Spanfelner, which provides for the County to drill, blast and any other incidents necessary for the removal of rock from a rock deposit on the Spanfelner property located on the Mountain Road approximately one-half mile west of the intersection of the Mountain and Lowery Roads.

AGREEMENTS-TEHAMA COUNTY PARKS-

Resolution No. 88-1965, a resolution authorizing the Chairman and Clerk of the Board to execute a Right of Way to the Pacific Gas and Electric Company for a portion of the Simpson Fennell Park for the purpose of extending electric distribution facilities, was offered by Supervisor Pickell and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. SUPERVISORS ORDERS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the District Attorney be authorized to prepare a notice of intent to purchase real property, with a hearing to be held on November 30, 1965 at 10:30 a.m. and the notice of intent to be published once a week for three weeks in the Corning Daily Observer and Red Bluff Daily News.

At this time the Agricultural Commissioner appeared before the Board and distributed copies of a report concerning anticipated costs involved for the destruction of stray cats for a period of one year. Discussion was held by the Board and the District Attorney was requested to prepare an ordinance to provide for such a program, as outlined.

At this time Lloyd Countryman, representative of the Gerber Community Club; George Roberts, operator of a dance hall; the District Attorney; Undersheriff Don Phillips and residents of the Gerber area held a discussion concerning behavior of persons in the community of Gerber on nights of a public dance. The Clerk read a proposed ordinance which amends Ordinance No. 343 and provides regulations relative to public dances.

ORDINANCES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a proposed ordinance amending Ordinance No. 343 and providing regulations relative to public dances be considered read for the first time.

Mrs. Silvia Corwell appeared before the Board to complain that the Welfare Department has denied her a rest home license. The matter was referred to Supervisor Snelson as Chairman of the Board's Welfare Committee, and was requested to report his findings next Board meeting.

Glenn Besnah, Junior Whitney and another resident of the Reeds Creek Road area appeared before the Board together with the Road Commissioner to discuss a drainage problem on said road. The District Attorney was requested to determine legality in connection with the present drainage pipe.

Meeting resumed at 1:15 p.m. with all members present.
