

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Dale Pickell, George Hoag, Rudolph Brodnansky, Earl Davies and Raymond Snelson. District Attorney Robert W. Trimble was also present.

Chairman Earl Davies presided: Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Sharon Baker, Deputy.

TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL-

Pursuant to the request of the Hospital Administrator, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Hoag that the County Health Officer and Hospital Administrator be authorized to attend a meeting in Sacramento on November 20, 1965 for the purpose of studying new legislation.

SUPERVISOR'S ORDERS-

Resolution No. 95-1965, a resolution requesting the Public Utilities Commission to reject certain proposals concerning rate relationships for telephone service and to order present interim rates into effect as permanent rates, was offered by Supervisor Hoag and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. SUPERVISOR'S ORDERS-SHERIFF-ORDINANCES-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Sheriff, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Ordinance No. 369, an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 343 and providing regulations relative to public dances, be adopted. (See Ordinance Book C).

SUPERVISOR'S ORDERS-COUNTY PROPERTY-

Pursuant to the recommendation of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that a public hearing set for November 30, 1965 at 10:30 a.m. scheduled for the purpose of considering the purchase of property situated at 624 Washington St., Red Bluff, California, be extended until December 14, 1965 at 10:30 a.m.

Pursuant to the request of the Department Heads, a motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky and seconded by Supervisor Hoag that the following appointments be approved:

At this time the Agricultural Commissioner appeared before the Board to discuss a proposed resolution concerning the control of stray, unwanted or abandoned cats.

AGRICULTURAL COMMISSIONER-

Resolution Number 96-1965; a resolution authorizing the Animal Control Officer to accept unwanted, abandoned or stray cats at the County Pound for destruction or sale; was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 190).

ASSESSMENTS AND TAXES-

Pursuant to the request of the United States Department of the Interior and with the consent of the District Attorney, and approval of the Assessor and Tax Collector, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make the following cancellations on the current fiscal year Assessment Rolls, under the provisions of Section 4986 of the Revenue and Taxation Code on property conveyed to the United States of America by:

Pursuant to the approval of the Auditor, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to transfer \$50.00 from Contingencies to #27 Fixed Assets, Fire Truck, of the Lassen View Fire Dept. Budget.

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following claims be approved:

Supervisor Brodnansky reported to the group at large, that he attended a joint Glenn-Colusa-Tehama County meeting on Nov. 4, 1965 which was held to discuss to what extent the counties will participate in the State Department of Mental Hygiene Program. Mr. Brodnansky stated that a proposed agreement will be sent to this Board for its consideration.

Bill Buffum of Buffum & Harris Insurance appeared before the Board to explain rates for insurance coverage of County Vehicles for the present fiscal year.

RECESS AT 10:45 A.M.

Meeting resumed at 11:00 a.m. with all members present.

At this time the Chairman called to order a public hearing for the purpose of considering proposed revisions in the Master Plan of Parks and Recreation. Lynn Raymond, Secretary of the Tehama County Planning Commission was present for the hearing. There being no objections voiced, the hearing was closed.

TEHAMA COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION-TEHAMA COUNTY PARKS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell and seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that proposed revisions in the adopted Master Plan of Parks and Recreation be approved to reclassify a site located on the east bank of the Sacramento River adjacent to the Red Bluff Division Dam as a proposed State Recreation Area and to reclassify an area located on the east bank of the Sacramento River in the vicinity of Mill Creek from a proposed Wildlife Conservation Board public river access project to a "County Camp, Park Development" site.

The Welfare Director and Mrs. Sylvia Corwell appeared before the Board to discuss Mrs. Corwell's application for a rest home license. The Welfare Director explained that State of California Regulations recommend that such license not be issued to persons over 70 years of age; however, she further explained that no license would be required should Mrs. Corwell be able to work out an amiable "share expense and work" agreement with her friend.

The Road Commissioner and Glenn Eesnah appeared before the Board to discuss a drainage pipe located on the Besnah property. The Road Commissioner suggested that the pipe be relocated to lie along a lot line. Mr. Besnah stated that he is willing to grant a twelve foot easement required for the project.

DISTRICT ATTORNEY-ROADS & BRIDGES- Reeds Creek Road

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that the District Attorney be requested to prepare an easement agreement from Glenn Besnah to the County of Tehama for property needed for a drainage project in connection with Reeds Creek Road.

ROADS & BRIDGES-Reeds Creek Road-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that the Road Department be authorized to proceed with a drainage project off of Reeds Creek Road on the Glenn Besnah property when the necessary easement has been obtained.

At this time Gordon Chester, Traffic Engineer of the State Division of Highways, appeared before the Board to explain a solution to an engineering problem at the intersection of Barham Road and Blackburn Avenue. Discussion was held by the Board and the proposed plan was accepted by the majority of the Board.

Allen Jones of the Department of Housing and Community Development appeared before the Board to briefly explain new legislation relating to structural standards for mobile homes.

Grover Davis appeared before the Board to request that Burnham Avenue be taken into the County Road System. The Road Commissioner stated that the necessary resolution would be prepared and presented to the Board at its next meeting.

ROADS & BRIDGES-

Resolution No. 97-1965; a resolution requesting that the full amount of Federal-aid Secondary Funds and State Highway Matching Funds be made available to Tehama for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967; was offered by Supervisor Brodnansky and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution and Order Book 3, Page 192)

ROADS AND BRIDGES--AGREEMENTS--

Pursuant to the recommendation of the Road Commissioner, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board members present that the Chairman be authorized to execute Right-of-Way Contracts with the Hovey Pollard Investment Company and with Vernon R. Lynn and Johnnie M. Lynn which provide for grants of easement to the County in connection with a project on Gyle Road.

The Road Commissioner distributed to Board members a sketch of a proposed bridge at Fickumway for their consideration.

A letter from Jack Huggins concerning a drainage problem on the Malton Switch Road. The Road Commissioner was requested to investigate the matter.

A letter from Hubert Clemence was discussed which complains of a gate across Walnut Street and blocks his entrance to his property.

ROADS AND BRIDGES--

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson and seconded by Supervisor Pickell that a gate be allowed across Walnut Street, south of Orange Avenue. Motion carried by the following vote of the board:

Ayes: Supervisors ---4
Noes: Supervisor Davies

Discussion was held concerning the written complaint of Dr. H. R. Merhof against a Road Department employee.

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag that A. V. Marcus be dismissed. The motion died for lack of a second.

Following discussion the majority of the Board agreed that Departmental Heads should be allowed, whenever possible, to use their discretion in disciplinary matters.

There being no further business appearing the meeting adjourned at 2:15 p.m.
