

MINUTES FOR THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
TUESDAY, DECEMBER 23, 1965

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 10:00 a.m. on the above mentioned date with the following members present: Supervisors Raymond Snelson, Earl Davies, Rudolph Brodnansky, Dale Pickell and George Hoag. District Attorney Robert W. Trimble was also present.

Chairman Earl Davies presided; Clerk Floyd A. Hicks, by Betty J. Mooney, Deputy.

BIDS--

A motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following bids be accepted for county supplies for the six months period commencing January 1, 1966: Lassen View Dairy, dairy products for the Tehama County Hospital and Jail; Interstate Bakeries Corp, bread products for the Tehama County Hospital and Jail; and, Red Bluff Douglas Service, lubrication, washing, gas and oil for County vehicles.

BIDS--Drugs--Groceries--

There being no bids received for furnishing the county with drugs and groceries, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Tehama County Hospital and Jail be authorized to purchase drugs and groceries on the open market for the six months period commencing January 1, 1966.

BIDS--Burial of indigent dead--

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the bid of Hoyt's Funeral Home be accepted for burial of indigent dead for the year 1966.

BIDS--Meats--

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the bid of Minch's Wholesale Meats be accepted for furnishing the Tehama County Hospital and Jail with meat products for the month of January, 1966.

TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL--

Resolution No. 115--1965, a resolution establishing new rates at the Tehama County Hospital, effective January 1, 1966, was offered by Supervisor Snelson and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board. (See Resolution & Order Book 3, Page 213)

TEHAMA COUNTY HOSPITAL--

Pursuant to the request of the Hospital Administrator, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Hospital Administrator be authorized to obtain bids from local credit agencies for collection of the Tehama County Hospital's delinquent accounts receivable, with said bids to be presented to the Board on January 7, 1966 for its consideration.

Mr. Grover Davis appeared before the Board to request information concerning the status of condemnation proceedings against him for property located on Corning Road No. 96 and to request that said proceedings continue.

DISTRICT ATTORNEY--

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky and seconded by Supervisor Pickell that the District Attorney be authorized to proceed with condemnation proceedings against Grover Davis, et al in connection with property located on the Corning Road. Motion carried by the following vote of the Board:

AYES: Supervisors Pickell, Brodnansky, Snelson and Hoag.
NOES: Supervisor Davies

Bids for mechanical repairs and parts for county vehicles were reviewed. Mr. Manuel Rodrigues, in behalf of the Road Department, was requested to investigate the amounts expended for labor and parts separately to determine which item is the greater.

BIDS--SUPERVISORS ORDERS--

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the bids for mechanical repairs and parts for county vehicles be held for further investigation to be awarded on January 4, 1966 and that the clerk notify the participating bidders.

BIDS--Tires and Tubes--

Pursuant to the recommendation of Mr. Manuel Rodrigues, in behalf of the Road Department, a motion was made by Supervisor Snelson, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the bid of Montgomery Ward Retail Store be accepted for furnishing truck tires and tubes to the County for the six months period commencing January 1, 1966 and that the bid of C. P. Tire Service be accepted for furnishing passenger tires and tubes to the County for the six months period commencing January 1, 1966.

ROADS & BRIDGES--AGREEMENTS--

Pursuant to the recommendation of Mr. Manuel Rodrigues, in behalf of the Road Department, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign a Materials Agreements with H. P. Edwards, et ux for gravel to be removed from their property in Paynes Creek Slough and with Ella Rogers for gravel to be removed from her property located on Salt Creek.

ROAD DEPARTMENT--

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Brodnansky and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Road Commissioner, or his representative, be authorized to attend a public hearing to be conducted by the Division of Buildings & Housing Standards, State of California which is to be held January 18, 1966 at 9 a.m. in Los Angeles, California.

At this time, Mr. Walter W. Dale stated that a certain area of his property had for some time been unofficially utilized by County residents for a dump area. He offered to rent the above mentioned property to the County for a fee of \$1.00 per year so that it could officially be declared a dump. The District Attorney was requested to prepare an agreement to accept Mr. Dale's offer.

At this time Supervisor Brodnansky stated that the Road Commissioner recommended the sale of the depleted gravel pit owned by the County which is located on Illinois Avenue, north of the Merrill School described as the South half of Lot 4, of Block 174, in Section 33, Tehama County. The Chairman requested Mr. Manuel Rodrigues, in behalf of the Road Department, to furnish the Board with a estimate of the value of the property at the next scheduled meeting.

PERSONNEL--

Pursuant to the request of the Department Heads, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the following actions be approved:

- a) Tehama Co. Road Dept.
Clintus Lee Shope, Const. Maint. Worker I, granted military leave of absence, effective December 24, 1965, until June 24, 1966.
- b) Corning Justice Court
Charlene F. White, appointed temporary Court Clerk, Range 16, Step A, \$1.88 per hour for December 17, 1965 only.

c) Assessor & Tax Collector

Dona Lee Bradley, reclassified from extra help Inter. Typist Clerk, Range 15, Step A, \$1.79 per hour to regular Inter. Typist Clerk, Range 15, Step B, \$225.00 per month, effective

TRANSFER OF FUNDS-

Pursuant to the request of the department heads, and with the approval of the Auditor, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make the following transfer of funds:

a) Supt of Schools

\$15.00 from Fixed Assets, Equipment -- papercutter, to Fixed Assets, Equipment -- steel file.

b) Welfare Department

\$19.32 from chairs, \$12.61 from steel partitions, \$47.94 from file cabinets, \$3.12 from desks and \$21.27 from steno chairs to: Cars for total transfer of \$130.00.

ASSESSMENTS & TAXES-

Pursuant to the request of the Assessor and Tax Collector, and with the consent of the District Attorney, a motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Pickell, and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Auditor be authorized to make the following adjustments to the 1965-1966 Assessment Rolls, under the provisions of the Revenue and Taxation Code:

a) Assessment #1633, Marvin Skinner, et ux - \$390. value to be cancelled from Personal Property and Total Column. \$32.10 to be cancelled from 2nd installment of taxes. Double Assessment, see Bill #17109. Personal property located in Antelope.

b) Assessment #14203, Vernon Dale Cauty, et al - \$450. value to be cancelled from Improvement & Total Column. \$3.44 to be refunded on first installment and \$26.07 to be cancelled from Second Installment. Building burned 12/19/64. Assessor not notified until after 1st installment was paid.

c) Assessment #3943, Grant R. Roberts, et al - \$1000. value to be cancelled from Total Column and added to exemption column. \$82.30 to be cancelled from Second Installment of Taxes. LaBerne & Grant R. Roberts are both veterans and signed in proper time - only one exemption was allowed.

PERSONNEL-SHERIFF

Pursuant to the request of the Sheriff, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell, and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Thomas Donald Cleary be appointed as extra help Aux. Deputy Sheriff Range 14, Step A, \$1.70 per hour, effective December 24, 1965 as guard duty for the Juvenile Hall and Hospital when needed.

BONDS-INSURANCE-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Hoag and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Chairman be authorized to sign an application for renewal of the County's public employees faithful performance blanket bond with United States Fidelity and Guaranty Co. in the amount of \$2,500.00 to commence February 19, 1966.

A letter from Congressman Harold T. Johnson, informing the Board that an acting postmaster will be installed at the Flournoy post office coincident with the resignation of the present postmaster was read and discussed at this time.

MEMORIAL BUILDINGS-

Pursuant to the recommendation of Supervisor Hoag, a motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that Maurice Hale be reappointed as a member of the Corning Veterans Memorial Building Committee for a four year term effective January 1, 1966.

MINUTES-

A motion was made by Supervisor Brodnansky, seconded by Supervisor Pickell, and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the Minutes of the previous meeting be approved as mailed.

WARRANTS-

A motion was made by Supervisor Pickell, seconded by Supervisor Snelson and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the General Warrant Register 1965-66, pages 193-198 inclusive, as presented by the Auditor, be approved as mailed.

AUDITOR-

A motion was made by Supervisor Hoag, seconded by Supervisor Pickell and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board that the claim of the Dept of Conservation, Division of Forestry in the amount of \$50,422.13 for California State Fire Contract services for the period July 1 to November 30, 1965, be approved.

Mr. Burt Rathjay who resides in the Hooker District appeared before the Board to register a complaint concerning his increased taxes.

There being no further business appearing, the meeting adjourned at 11:17 a.m.
